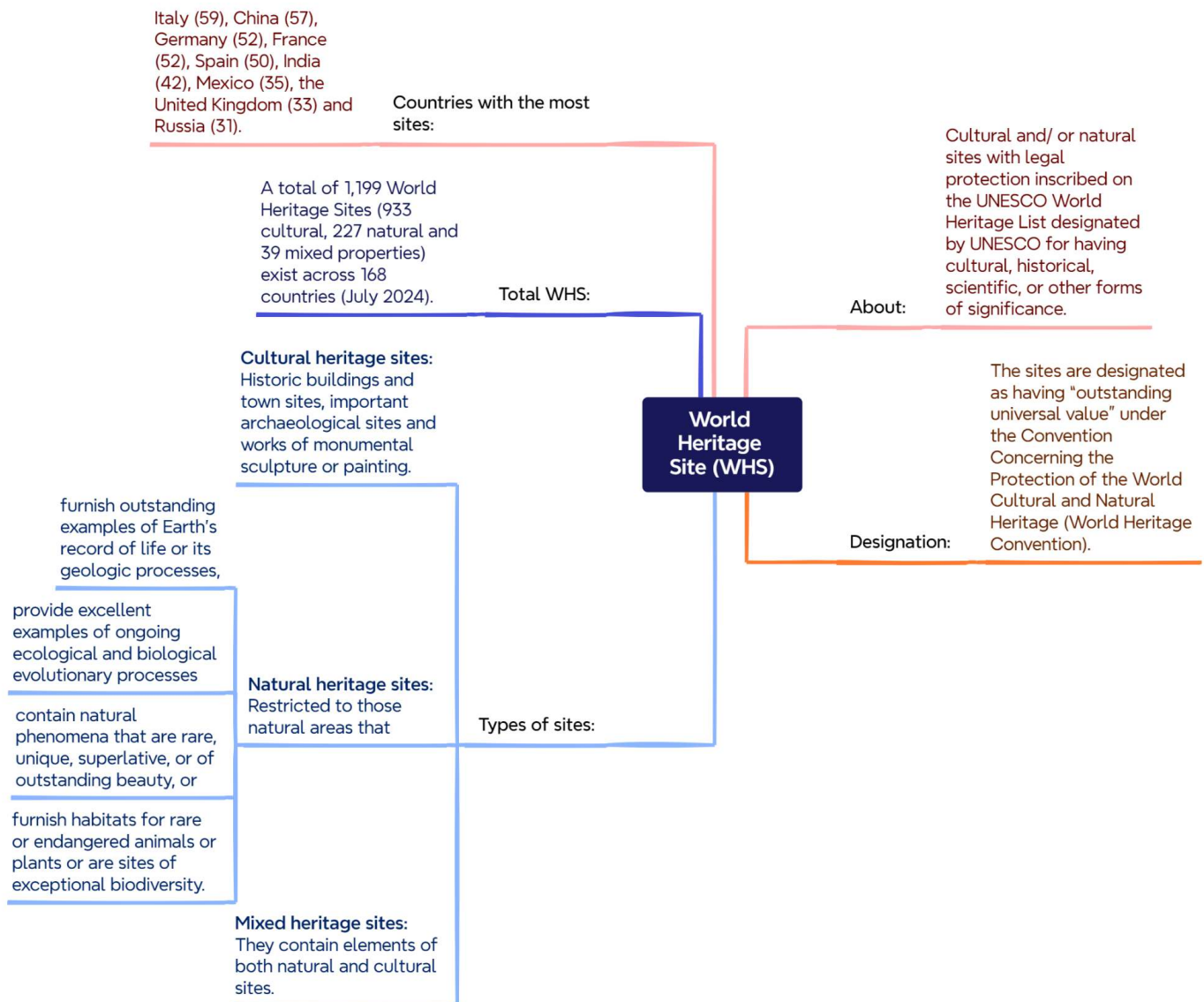

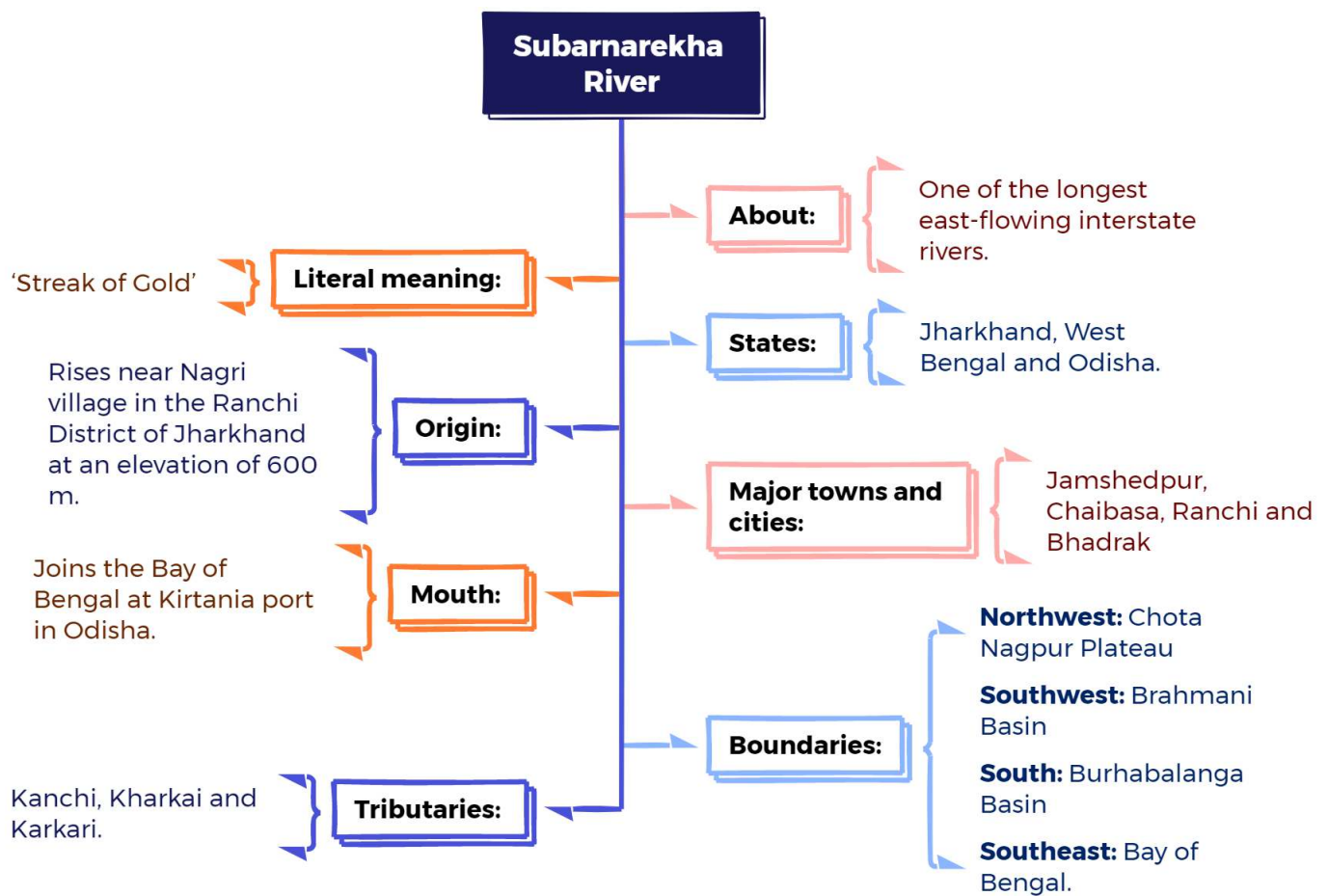

4. Why Commons matter, how community is key to their well-being - Indian Express

Context >>

Delhi, last month, hosted a first-of-its-kind dialogue on the conservation, restoration and governance of common resources such as forests, community lands, and water bodies like lakes or rivers, all usually referred to just as Commons.

Commons >>

International agreements:
For instance, for the use and management of polar regions, outer space, and high seas.

Paris Agreement on climate change

Governance mechanisms to manage Commons:

About:
A term used to refer to resources that are not owned by any individual or group or the government, but belong to, and are shared by, the community as a whole.

Over-exploitation and damage. Since no one owns Commons, the responsibility of maintenance and upkeep often becomes a problem.

Commons have also come under increased stress due to climate change.

Threats:

Examples:
Forests, local ponds, grazing lands, rivers, and sacred sites, parks and lakes.

Can be intangible too:
For example, language, folk art or dance, local customs, and traditional knowledge are all shared resources, and thus are Commons.

Commons

They provide a variety of ecological and other services that are beneficial for the entire community. But they need to be maintained, preserved, and used sustainably.

Significance:

Commons at the international level:
For example, polar regions, the Arctic and Antarctica, moon, and other planetary bodies. No country is allowed to take ownership of these areas, even though everyone can use them for certain kinds of activities.

5. Destruction from Israeli strike on UNRWA school-turned-shelter – The Hindu

Context >>

An Israeli strike on an UNRWA school-turned-shelter has killed at least 18 people and injured over a dozen others in Nuseirat, Gaza. Video from the scene shows bags of food with the UNRWA logo amid the rubble from which rescuers were removing bodies.

6. India sends supplies to typhoon-hit Laos, Myanmar, Vietnam – The Hindu

Context >>

India recently launched Operation Sadbhav to provide humanitarian assistance and disaster relief (HADR) to Laos, Myanmar, and Vietnam that have been hit by severe flooding caused by Typhoon Yagi.

Operation Sadbhav >>

- **India's commitment:** India has committed \$1 million worth of flood relief assistance to Vietnam and \$1,00,000 worth of assistance to Laos.
- **Other aids:** Dry ration, clothing and medicines left for Myanmar onboard INS Satpura.
- **IAF's contribution:** Carrying 35 tonnes of aid comprising water purification items, water containers, blankets, kitchen utensils, solar lanterns for Vietnam.
- **Ten tonnes of aid to Laos:** Comprises genset, water purification items, hygiene supplies, mosquito nets, blankets and sleeping bags.

Context >>

Provides multilingual information on popular ornamental fish species in 8 Indian languages.

Offers comprehensive details on care, breeding, and maintenance practices to both farmers and hobbyists.

"Find Aquarium Shops" tool which allows users to locate nearby aquarium shops through a dynamic directory updated by shop owners.

Includes educational modules for both newcomers and professionals in the ornamental fish industry.

Rangeen Machhli App

About:

An app to meet the growing needs of the ornamental fisheries sector, providing crucial knowledge resources for hobbyists, aquarium shop owners and fish farmers.

Development:

8. Nipah death confirmed in Malappuram; 150 contacts asked to isolate themselves - The Hindu

Context >>

Health authorities in Kerala confirmed the Nipah virus as the reason for the death of a 24-year-old man from Wandoor in Malappuram district.

Virus scare returns to Kerala

The state has prepared a contact list of over 160 high-risk individuals with the help of grassroots health workers and has also set up isolation wards

SPECIES THAT SPREAD INFECTION
Pteropus giganteus, Eonycteris spelaea, Cynopterus sphinx, Scotophilus kuhlii and Hipposideros larvatus are species of fruit bats found in India and have been known to be infected with the Nipah virus

HOW IT SPREADS

- 1 FOOD, FLUIDS**
Consuming food and fluids contaminated with saliva and droppings of infected bats
- 2 DATE PALM SAP**
Eating fruits and drinking raw date palm sap contaminated with saliva of infected bats
- 3 ANIMALS**
Infection of domestic animals (cattle, pigs, goats) from eating food contaminated by infected bats' saliva or droppings
- 4 PEOPLE**
Human-to-human, through contaminated body fluids of an infected person

SYMPTOMS

- Fever**
- Headache**
because of encephalitis (inflammation of the brain)
- Drowsiness**
- Disorientation and mental confusion**
for 3-14 days
- Epilepsy or respiratory illness**
may occur
- Coma**
Infected may slowly slip into coma

PREVENTING INFECTION

- Avoid fruits bitten by birds or animals
- Scrub hands after being in close contact with the sick
- Wear double masks and gloves while looking after the sick
- Wear PPE kits if visiting hospital

TREATMENT

- No vaccine for animals or humans
- Primary treatment for humans is supportive care

The natural host of the virus are fruit bats
