



## Purpose & Role:

- Established to assist the government in reviewing the operation of laws and recommending necessary reforms.
- Proposes the repeal of outdated legislation and suggests new legal frameworks for contemporary issues.
- Provides recommendations on matters referred by the government, ensuring legal modernization.

## /Impact & Contributions

- Since Independence, <u>22 Law</u> **Commissions** have been constituted.
- <u>289 reports</u> submitted, addressing key legal and policy issues.
- Government is <u>not obligated</u> to implement recommendations; Many have shaped major legislative reforms, such as:
  - Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 (CrPC)
  - (RTE Act) Ensured free and mandatory education for children
