- This year, Chaitra Shukla Pratipada was celebrated instead of the traditional March 30.
- From March 25 to April 1, programmes were organised across the state on various themes.
- Background: 'Greater Rajasthan' was established by Sardar Patel in 1949 on Chaitra Shukla Pratipada.

Saksham Jaipur Campaign

- It was started by the Jaipur District Administration.
- Students of classes 6 to 12 were given selfdefence training and information about Rajcop App.
- The campaign was carried out in two phases in collaboration with the Education Department and women safety organizations.

Operation Dignity

- (1–15 March 2025) Initiative of Jaipur Police Commissionerate.
- Monitoring to prevent eve-teasing of women in schools, colleges, parks and mini-city buses.
- Women and girls were given information about self-defense training and Rajcop Citizen App (Need Help).

Chief Minister's Announcements – Finance and Appropriation Bill Discussion (12 March 2025)

Drinking Water Improvement

- Instead of 1500 hand pumps, now 2500 hand pumps will be installed.
- An untied fund of Rs 1 crore to each District Collector (for summer contingencies) for quick resolution of drinking water problems.

Planned Development and Civic Amenities

- On three major highways, there will be 5 facilities each and resting places for large vehicles near the Zero Accident Zones including eye check-up and medical facilities.
- For road safety, 10 automated testing stations will be set up with private support.
- A theme park will be constructed in Jaisalmer.
- The time limit for conversion of rural nonagricultural land will be reduced from 45 to 30 days.

- Bhiwadi Development Authority (BIDA Rescheduling)
- Dausa-Bandikui Nagar Vikas Trust (for





- DMIC Logistic Hub)

- Street lights: The number of street lights will be increased from the earlier announced 50,000 to 1 lakh street lights.

Industrial Development

- VAT on CNG and PNG will be reduced to 7.5%.
- Entrepreneurs will get GST, VAT, electricity tariff details through ITMS portal.
- To increase the participation of migrant Rajasthanis, new chapters of Rajasthan Foundation will be opened in cities like Guwahati, Pune, Delhi, Dubai, Singapore, Tokyo, Nairobi, Melbourne etc.
- District Mineral Foundation Trust (DMFT) will be established in the newly formed districts (Beawar, Balotra, Deedwana-Kuchaman, Deeg etc.).

Tourism, Art & Culture

- 'India and Rajasthan Pehchan Tour Programme' will be started to acquaint the youth with cultural heritage.
- In future, Rajasthan Day will be celebrated on Chaitra Shukla Pratipada (historically Greater Rajasthan was established on this day).
- Sant Sadaram Ji Maharaj Panorama will be constructed in Guhra (Jaisalmer).

Youth Development & Welfare

- Chief Minister Youth Employment Promotion Scheme
 - One-time assistance of ₹10,000 to youth seeking jobs in the organized private sector for the first time (if salary is less than ₹50,000/month).

• Skills & Career Counselling

- Establishment of Centre for Advanced Skilling & Career Counselling in Jaipur, Bharatpur and Udaipur (Budget ₹100 crore).
- PM Internship / ₹ 6,000 monthly stipend (in place of unemployment allowance) to the youth involved in the National Apprenticeship Program.

Initiatives in Education Sector

- New agriculture colleges will be set up in Piplund-Bhilwara and Rajsamand.
- The new campus of IIT Jodhpur will be set up in Jaipur Coaching Hub.
- The upcoming session will start the Mukhyamantri Shiksha Rajasthan Abhiyan (MSRA) to implement NEP and improve the

- quality of education.
- Rajasthan State Open School to introduce an on-demand examination system – benefit to children of working and disadvantaged sections.
- Adarsh Ved residential school will be set up at Taratara Math (Barmer) and Gomrakh Dham.
- Residential school for cattle rearers will be opened in Rajsamand.

Development of Sports Facilities

- A Sports Directorate will be set up at the state level.
- A multipurpose sports complex will be constructed in Bhilwara, a cycle track in Sriganganagar, and a sports stadium in Kumher-Deeg and Keshoraipatan-Bundi.

Medical & Health

- State-of-the-art Thalassemia Centre will be established at RIMS (Jaipur).
- Prevention and control programs will also be run for the prevention of thalassemia.
- The quantity of milk available to children in Anganwadi centers will be increased from 15 grams to 25 grams per packet.
- Comprehensive Lactation Management Centres (CLMC) will be set up in 8 medical colleges and Lactation Management Units (LMU) in 11 other hospitals.
- A Stroke Interventional and Rehabilitation Unit will be set up at SMS Hospital, Jaipur.

Social Security

- Pt. Deendayal Upadhyaya Poverty Free Village Scheme launched – 5,000 villages in the first phase, Budget ₹300 crore.
- The number of scooty facilities for differentlyabled youth will be increased from 2,000 to 2,500.
- Under Lakhpati Didi women will get the loan at 1.5% interest rate.
- The savings bond amount of Lado Protsahan Yojana will be increased from ₹1 lakh to ₹1.5 lakh.
- At the block level, 10 outstanding women from Lakhpati Didi, Drone Didi, Solar Didi, Bank Sakhi, Krishi Sakhi, Pashu Sakhi will be given awards and tablets.
- Provision of ₹ 450 crore under Devnarayan
 Fund for the welfare of underprivileged sections and MBC.

Agriculture & Animal Husbandry

 Subsidy will be provided on 60,000 solar power pumps (for micro irrigation).





- One Time Settlement (OTS) scheme for PLDB loans will be launched.
- Rajasthan's first 'Centre of Excellence Indigenous Farm' will be set up in Pali for the conservation of indigenous animals.

Green Growth

- Under the "Karmabhoomi Se Mathrubhumi" campaign, 5,000 water recharge structures will be built with CSR funding.
- New conservation reserves will be set up at Mokhla Parewar (Jaisalmer) and Buchara Main (Jaipur).
- A biological park will be constructed in Bharatpur.
- Godavan conservation will be done in a 2,000 hectare area in National Desert Park, Jaisalmer.

Law and order and civil safety

- 'Rajasthan Civil Defence Act' will be brought to ensure a safe environment for the common man.
- 25.000 CCTV cameras will be installed.
- 250 additional Kalika patrolling units will be set up for women safety.
- 70 Mobile Forensic Units for collection of forensic evidence for new forensic codes.

Institute for Justice and Financial Efficiency

- Under National Law University, Jodhpur

Cabinet Meeting: Important Decisions

 The Rajasthan Cabinet meeting was held on 8 March 2025 under the chairmanship of Chief Minister Bhaian Lal Sharma.

Key Decisions

- State Skill Policy approved The youth will be prepared for global competition by giving special skill training according to industrial demand.
- RTI institutes will be transformed into advanced skill centres – provision of new courses, modules and on-the-job training.
- Model Career Centres will be set up at divisional headquarters – skill training, career counselling, internship and employment information.
- The youth will be trained in automation, AI, machine learning, manufacturing and cyber security and will be prepared for Industry 4.0.

Energy and Environment

- Land Allotment for Solar Power Projects: Jaisalmer – New Luna Kalan
- Phalodi Village Nokh
- Bikaner Gram Kela, Kalasar and Sawaisar

Decisions Based on Employee Interests

- State employees will get the benefit of increased gratuity in line with the central government from January 1, 2024.
- Under the Rajasthan Voluntary Rural Education Service Rules, 2010, the designation of teachers will now be Assistant Professor, Associate Professor and Professor instead of Lecturer.
- The Rajasthan District Gazetteer Service Rules, 1980 (attached to the department abolished in the year 2007) will be deleted.

Welfare of Divyangjans

- Approval of Equal Opportunity Policy applicable in all departments, offices and autonomous institutions.
- Specially abled persons will be exempted from rotational transfers as far as possible.





 Preference in Transfer/Promotion: Persons with Disabilities, Parents of children with severe disabilities

Rajasthan Honouring Fighters of Democracy Bill 2024

- Passed in the Assembly: Passed by voice vote on 21 March 2025.
- Period applicable: For fighters jailed between 25 June 1975 and 21 March 1977 for defending democracy.
- Effective Date: Rule re-effective from 1st January 2024 (Announcement – 14th March 2024).
- Beneficiaries: Total 1,140 (921 surviving fighters
 + dependents of 219 deceased fighters).
- Provision:
 - ₹20,000 Monthly Pension
 - ₹4,000 Monthly Medical Aid
 - Free transport facility
 - Lifelong honorarium and medical assistance to spouse
- Eligibility: Rajasthan residents who were detained under MISA, Defence of India Act 1971 or CrPC.

The Rajasthan Ground Water (Conservation and Management) Authority Bill, 2025

- Passed in Assembly: 19 March 2025
- Objective: To prevent the depleting groundwater level and ensure equitable water use.
- Key Provisions:
 - Constitution of State Level Authority for Ground Water Control and Management.
 - District Committee Formulation of local planning in each district.
 - Charges on water use other than irrigation
 - 6 months in jail + ₹50,000 to ₹1 lakh fine for boring without permission
 - Rainwater harvesting mandatory especially in urban construction
- Membership: Chief Engineer level Chairman, 2
 MLAs, 2 Ground Water Experts
- Background: According to the 2023 study, 216 blocks in the state are in the 'over-exploited' category.

Revision of criteria for declaring new villages

- Announcement: Revision of old norms by the Government of Rajasthan.
- New Parameters:
 - General Area: Dhani/Majra with a population of 200 may be declared as a revenue village.

- Desert and Scheduled Tribe Area:
 Minimum population fixed at 150.
- Condition: The remaining population in the original revenue village should not be less than 200 in the general area.
- Implementation: New guidelines issued to all District Magistrates.

Appointment of 4 Judges in Rajasthan High Court

- On 28th March 2025, 4 advocates were appointed as judges in the Rajasthan High Court:
 - Anand Sharma Senior Counsel of Central Government (Jaipur)
 - 2. Sunil Beniwal Former Chairman, Rajasthan Bar Council (Jodhpur)
 - Mukesh Rajpurohit Deputy Solicitor General (Jodhpur)
 - 4. Sandeep Shah Former Additional Advocate General (Jodhpur)
- The total number of judges has now increased from 34 to 38.
- 7 advocates were recommended by the Supreme Court Collegium (including 1 woman).
- Three names yet to be approved: Sandeep Taneja, Baljinder Singh Sandhu, Shital Mirdha.
- Currently there are 3 women judges: Rekha Borana, Shubha Mehta, Dr. Nupur Bhati.

- Performed at the IIFA Awards ceremony for the third time on 9th March 2025.
- The first folk artist of Rajasthan who has this achievement.

Dr. Pramod Yewle - Vice-Chancellor of RSU

- Appointed Vice-Chancellor of Rajasthan University of Health Sciences (RSU).
- Tenure: 5 years or 70 years of age (whichever is earlier).
- For the first time, this responsibility was entrusted to a non-medical professional.

 Angela Swamy from Bikaner won first position in the Mrs. Universe 2025 competition held in Thailand (Pattaya).

- It was the winning film of Biennale College Cinema 2025.
- After a decade, an Indian film was selected in this category.

- Dronacharya awardee Saini has been appointed as the coach of the Indian para-athletics team.
- World Para Athletics Grand Prix 2025 March 11 to 13, Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium, New Delhi.
- Event Under the aegis of Paralympic Committee of India.

Dr. Saurabh Sharma – Representation in Global Culinary Education

Kota – First Food Bank for Herbivorous Wildlife

• Development of grassland in 600 hectares near

- Mukundra Hills Tiger Reserve.
- Area: Dara to Kishore Sagar Forest Area.
- Objective: To provide nutritious food to herbivorous wildlife in the wild itself.
- This will be the first special zone in Rajasthan which will function as a food bank.

Rajasthan's first 'Bharatiya Gyan Parampara Kendra'

- Established by RA Podar Institute of Management (affiliated to University of Rajasthan).
- Research Support Centre Free research-related information and guidance to students.
- Objective: To carry forward the Indian knowledge tradition.

IIT Kanpur to develop two schools in Jaipur

- Selected Schools:
 - Mahatma Gandhi Government School, New Vidyadhar Nagar
 - Mahatma Gandhi Government School, Mansarovar
- Programme: Centre of Excellence for Innovation in Basic Education
- Facilities: Modern Resources, Lab, Smart Classroom, Canteen, Play Ground, CCTV, etc.

Jaipur (Langdiawas) – Waste to Energy Plant

- A plant started by the Heritage Municipal Corporation.
- Capacity: 288 MW/day, 300 tons/day garbage disposal.
- Electricity Rate: ₹7.31 per unit (supplied to Jaipur Discom).
- Supply of waste to cement companies + production of building materials (bricks, tiles, blocks).

Rajasthan-Madhya Pradesh-Cheetah Corridor Sector Determination

- Determination by the Wildlife Institute of India (WII), Dehradun.
- Total area: 17,000 sq km
- MP: 10,500 km² (61%)
- Rajasthan: 6,500 km² (37%)
- Districts of Rajasthan: Kota, Baran, Jhalawar, Bundi, Sawai Madhopur, Karauli, Chittorgarh.
- The highest share will be from the Kota division.

Banswara – Rajasthan's first sensor-equipped hanging bridge

- Under construction at the confluence of Mahi and Anas rivers.
- Total length: 906 meters, cost: ₹105 crore.
- Rajasthan's first bridge equipped with sensor technology, second hanging bridge after Kota

International Institute of AI-Robotics – NIMS University, Jaipur

- Rajasthan's first International Artificial Intelligence-Robotics Institute launched at NIMS University.

- Partnership: MoU between the Government of Rajasthan and NIMS under the Rising Rajasthan initiative.
- Objective: To make Rajasthan a digital innovation and AI hub.

Breeding Centre of Siyago Caracal – Ranthambore

- Establishment of a breeding centre for the conservation of caracals.
- Caracal One of the rarest wild animals in the world, adept at hunting flying birds.
- Major Habitat Areas: Ranthambore (Rajasthan) and Kutch (Gujarat).

Rail Rakshak Dal Project – North Western Railway

- Country's first pilot project launched by North Western Railway Zone.
- Place of Posting : Bandikui, Udaipur, Lalgarh, Merta Road.
- Special training in collaboration with NDRF.
- Objective: To start relief and rescue operations in railway accidents within 60 minutes.

Artificial Insemination Technique Plant – Bassi, Jaipur

- Rajasthan's first Sex Sorted Semen Lab Plant.
- Partnership: Central Government, NDDB, RCDF, RLDB.
- Production capacity: 10 lakh doses per annum.
- 75% Subsidy per dose by the State Government.

Gobar Gas Plant – Bassi, Jaipur

- Plant based on Gujarat model by Rajasthan Cooperative Dairy Federation.
- Per day capacity: 1500kg
- Cost: ₹50 Crore | Partnership: RCDF, NDDB, Suzuki
- Objective: Increase farmers' income, organic farming and environmental protection
- Cow dung bought: 100 tonnes per day from nearby villages
- Operated: NDDB & Suzuki

India's longest 8-lane tunnel – Kota-Dara, Rajasthan

- Project: Delhi-Mumbai Expressway, under Bharatmala Project.
- Length: 5 km India's longest 8-lane tunnel
- Manufacturing Technology: New Austrian Tunnel Method (NATM)

Features:

- Eco-friendly sensors
- Automatic activation when pollution increases
- Opening: November 2025

Rajasthan Royals Sports Arena – Jaipur

- Rajasthan Royals signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) worth Rs 10,000 crore under Rising Rajasthan.
- A multi-sports arena called "Blackbug" will be developed on 500 acres in Chittora (Jaipur).
- Developing Entity: Royal Multisports Pvt. Ltd.
- Facilities: Cricket Stadium, Olympic Sports, Entertainment Arena, Academy, Club House, Convention Center, Hotel, Mall, Hospital, Training School and College.
- Team Base: Jaipur | Active in IPL since 2008.

Rawatbhata – 700 MW Nuclear Power Station Unit

- On 16th March 2025, power generation started for the first time from the 7th unit.
- Rajasthan's first 700 MW nuclear power unit.
- Total generation capacity: 1780 MW (80% increase).
- Specialty: The first unit in the country, where both fuel and electricity are produced at one place.
- Rajasthan will get 50% of the electricity.

Degana – a treasure trove of lithium and tungsten

- Huge mineral deposits confirmed in Revanth Hill (Degana) of Nagaur district.
- Reserves:
 - o 13.39 million tonnes of Tungsten



- o 6.33 Million Tons of Lithium
- o 16.42 million tonnes Niobium-tantalum
- Degana's lithium reserves can meet 80% of India's demand – more than J&K 's.
- Lithium Usage: In Mobile, Laptop, EV, Chargeable Batteries.

High-Speed Railway Test Track - Sambhar

- Under Construction Track: Gudha-Thathana Mithri (Jaipur-Jodhpur Road).
- Length: 64 km, cost: ₹967 crore
- Speed test: 220 km/h
- Testing: High-speed train, regular coach, goods wagon
- It is being developed on the lines of the US, Australia, and Japan.

Constitution Club of Rajasthan - Jaipur

- Inauguration: 8 March 2025, by Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla.
- Rajasthan Legislative Assembly The first assembly in the country in which this club was established.
- Construction on the lines of the Constitution Club of Delhi.
- Facilities: Website, Restaurant, Coffee House, Swimming Pool, Auditorium, Conference Hall, VIP Lounge, Gym, Salon, Badminton, Table Tennis, Lawn Tennis, Guest Room.

Manekshaw Centre of Excellence for National Security Studies and Research

- Country's first National Security Research Centre – named after Field Marshal Sam Manekshaw.
- Joint Institutes: IIIT Delhi, IIT Jodhpur, IIT Guwahati, IIT Kanpur, IIT Dharwad.
- First Meeting: 3 March 2025, IIIT Delhi | Included: Senior officers of all three armies.
- Objective: To strengthen defence capabilities under Atma Nirbhar Bharat and increase selfreliance in defence technology.
- Role: It will connect the defence forces, security agencies, research institutions and academia as nodal agencies.

• Institution-wise Specialization:

- IIT Jodhpur: Engine Design, UAV/RPA, Directed Energy Weapons
- IIT Guwahati: Communication, Shockwave, Control Blast Resistance, Hypersonic Applications
