RAJASTHAN AFFAIRS

MAJOR PROGRAMMES, SCHEMES, CAMPAIGNS

Aravalli Green Wall Project

- The central government

 s project will stretch from Porbandar in Gujarat to Panipat in Haryana.
- It will have a total length of 1400 km and a width of 5 km.
- It includes 29 districts of Rajasthan, Gujarat, Haryana and Delhi, with Rajasthan having the highest number of 19 districts.
- The highest land degradation in the Aravalli region has been recorded in Udaipur.

Dharti Aba Tribe Gram Utkarsh Abhiyan

- This state-level campaign was launched on 16 June 2025 from the Kotda block of Udaipur.
- It aims at holistic development of tribal areas.
- It covers 6,019 villages in 37 districts of Rajasthan .
- In this campaign, which runs till July 15, 2025, 18 departments will organize joint camps.
- It emphasizes on the outreach of schemes, sustainable agriculture, water management, empowerment of women and youth, and preservation of tribal culture.

Senior Citizen Pilgrimage Scheme 2025-26

- The Chief Minister inaugurated the scheme on 6 June 2025.
- The ⊠Rajasthan Vahini Bharat Gaurav Tourist Train' flagged off from Durgapura station in Jaipur.
- Under the scheme, 50,000 senior citizens will travel to 13 pilgrimage sites by airconditioned trains.
- Also, about 6,000 devotees will visit the Pashupatinath temple in Nepal by air.

Vande Ganga Water Conservation ☐ Jan Abhiyan

- On 5 June 2025, the Rajasthan government started this campaign from Keshoraipatan in Bundi.
- It will run from 5th to 20th June 2025 in all 41 districts of the state .
- Its tagline is ⊠ Respect water, take care of life.⊠ ⊠
- Nodal Agency: Department of Watershed Development and Soil Conservation.
- Objective: Improvement of water structures, recharge of groundwater table, reduction of

- water pollution, and improvement of water use habits.
- This includes repair of reservoirs, anicuts, canals, irrigation capacity augmentation and water harvesting works.

■Aapno Gaon - Swachh Suthro Gaon Campaign

- This cleanliness campaign will be started from 13th June 2025.
- The inauguration will be from Morak village (Ramganjmandi) in Kota district.
- It will be launched by Union Environment Minister Bhupender Yadav.
- Objective: To ensure cleanliness in every village by effectively implementing the Swachh Bharat Mission to the villages.

Financial Assistance for Mar Khet Ko Pani Campaign

- Rajasthan has received approval of ₹ 16.50 crore from the central government under the Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchai Yojana.
- This amount will be spent on 84 RRR (Repair, Renewal, Rehabilitation) projects in Kota, Bundi and Tonk districts.
- These projects will restore 4,404 hectares of land to irrigated areas.
- The financial participation of the Centre and the state in the scheme is in the ratio of 60:40.

Amendment in Plot Allotment Policy for Warehouses and Logistics Units

- To boost the logistics sector in Rajasthan, RIICO has changed its plot allotment policy.
- This amendment has been made under the Rajasthan Logistics Policy-2025.
- Plots will be reserved for logistics units in new industrial areas and dedicated logistics areas will be developed.
- Now the definition of logistics has been extended beyond the transportation of goods to points such as production, storage, consumption and value addition.
- All these facilities can be installed only on roads 18 meters wide or more.



Digital mapping in 10 cities of Rajasthan

- Digital mapping of the entire land area will be done through drone surveys in 10 cities of the state.
- This process is being started as a pilot project, after which it will be implemented in other cities as well.
- Pilot Cities: Bhiwadi, Kishangarh, Beawar, Sawai Madhopur, Jaisalmer, Pushkar, Bagru, Behror, Nawalgarh and Nathdwara.
- This will prepare a record of each plot and create a land bank.
- Under the project, civic amenities like sewers, street lights, manholes etc. will also be recorded in the digital map.

Pt. Deendayal Upadhyaya Antyodaya Sambal Pakhwada

- Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya Antyodaya Sambal Pakhwada was organized by the Government of Rajasthan from 24th June to 9th July 2025 .
- During this fortnight, camps were organized at the Gram Panchayat level.
- **Objective:** To provide direct benefits of government schemes to the general public.
- The following major works were carried out in these camps:
 - Disposal of pending stone quarry, boundary and nomination cases.
 - The Rural Development Department links BPL families with beneficial schemes.
 - Ownership leases and water conservation: The Panchayati Raj Department will distribute ownership pattas and repairs to catchment structures.
 - Water connections: PHED released pending water connections.
 - Scooty distribution: The Higher Education Department distributed scooty.
 - Entrance Ceremony and Educational Development
 - Animal Vaccination
 - Linking with the National Food Security Scheme
- The Collector was designated as the nodal officer to monitor these.

Sukalp Campaign

 In Rajasthan, this campaign has been started by Sukrupa Empower India Foundation in collaboration with the government and social organizations.

- Objective: To make slum children, especially girls, digitally literate.
- Special focus on raising awareness of social issues like child marriage.
- Under this, economically weaker students will be given opportunities to study in colleges and universities.

Ferozepur Feeder Reconstruction Project

- It is a joint project of Rajasthan and Punjab.
- **Objective:** To strengthen the Gangnahar system and to use it for irrigation of Rajasthan by stopping the excess water flowing towards Pakistan in the monsoon.
- Financial Statements
 - o Total Cost: ₹647.62 Crore
 - Share of Punjab Government:₹379.12 crore (approx. 58.5%)
 - Share of Government of Rajasthan:
 ₹268.50 crore (approx. 41.5%)
- **Note:** A provision of ₹ 200 crore was made in the budget 2024-25 of Rajasthan
- Approval of Central Water Commission (CWC): 24 April 2025
- The construction work will start in the year 2025.
- Estimated completion: in 2 years (until 2027)

Person in News

Utkal Ranjan (U.R.) Sahu appointed RPSC Chairman

- Former Rajasthan DGP Utkal Ranjan Sahu has been appointed as the chairman of the Rajasthan Public Service Commission (RPSC).
- He hails from Odisha and is a 1988 batch IPS officer.
- He replaced Sanjay Shrotriya; Kailash Chand Meena was the acting president after the term ended on 1 August 2024.
- Sahu\(\text{S}\) s tenure will be till June 2025.
- Also, Ravi Prakash Mehrada (DG-ACB) has been assigned the additional charge of Director General of Rajasthan Police.

Prof. Gaurav Vallabh appointed as member of Prime Minister⊠s Economic Advisory Council

- Prof. Gaurav Vallabh has been appointed as a member in the Economic Advisory Council to the Prime Minister (PM-EAC).
- This appointment has been made as an economist.
- They will advise the government on national and international economic issues.



- Prof. Vallabh has taught finance at prestigious institutions in India and abroad, such as IIMs.
- He hails from Pipar village in Jodhpur district and currently resides in Udaipur.

Prime Minister S Economic Advisory Council (PM-EAC)

- It is the apex body to advise the Prime Minister on economic and related matters.
- It is headed by senior economist S. Mahendra Deo.

IAS officer V Srinivas appointed as IIAS president

- V Srinivas, a 1998 batch IAS officer of Rajasthan cadre, has been elected as the chairman of the International Institute of Administrative Sciences (IIAS).
- For the first time in 75 years, an IAS officer has got this post.
- India received 61.7% of the votes in the election held on 3 June.

Prof. Bhagwati Prasad Saraswat

- Prof. Bhagwati Prasad Saraswat appointed as Vice-Chancellor of Kota University.
- Governor Haribhau Bagade appointed him as the Vice-Chancellor of Kota University.
- He will have a tenure of three years from the date of assumption of charge or till he attains the age of 70 years, whichever is earlier.

Shubhranshu Singh named World⊠s Top CMO

- Tata Motors CMO Shubhranshu Singh was named the Most Influential Chief Marketing Officer of 2025 by Forbes.
- The announcement was made at the Cannes Lions International Festival of Creativity (France).
- He is the only non-American, non-European and first Indian to feature in this list.
- He has also been inducted into the board of the Cannes Lions Effies Foundation.
- Shubhranshu Singh hails from Rajasthan.

Dr. Aditya Nag appointed as Vice President of Indian Soft Hockey League

- Rajasthan
 Soft Hockey Federation of India (ASHFI).
- The National President of ASHFI is Dr. Ashutosh Pant.
- Dr. Nag is an educationist, entrepreneur and social worker.

Lalit K Panwar appointed as special invitee advisor to NITI Aayog

- Dr. Lalit K Panwar, a former IAS officer, has been inducted as a special invitee advisor to NITI Aayog for his expert services in the tourism sector .
- He will give his suggestions for strengthening the operator sector economy from tourism, hotels, resorts and tours in the country.
- Dr. Lalit K Panwar is a renowned tourism expert of the country .

Places in News

Khichan and Menar become new Ramsar sites

- The central government declared Rajasthan⊠s Khichan and Menar wetlands as Ramsar sites
- With the addition of these sites, the total number of Ramsar sites in India has gone up to 91.

Menar Wetland (Udaipur)

- Location: Menar and Kheroda villages of Vallabhnagar (Udaipur).
- It is a monsoonal, freshwater wetland, made up of Brahma, Dhand and Kheroda ponds.
- It is home to more than 110 waterfowl species, including 67 migratory birds and some critically endangered vultures.

Khichan Adrabhoomi (Phalodi-Jodhpur)

- Located: Between Jodhpur and Phalodi, in the northern Thar Desert region.
- This desert wetland is formed by the Ratri River and the Vijaysagar Pond.
- It is home to more than 150 bird species.

Rajasthan's first Solar Lift Irrigation Project

- On 18 June 2025, Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla inaugurated the project on the Mej river in Lohali village of Bundi district.
- Total cost: ₹52 crore.
- Benefits: 25,000 bighas of agricultural land of 17 villages of Folai and Gendauli panchayats will be irrigated.



- The scheme will provide irrigation facilities in both Kharif and Rabi seasons.
- About 700 wells and 400 borings have been utilized.

Rajasthan's first Sant Kabir Research Centre - Kota

- The state's first Sant Kabir Research Centre will be set up at Mukundra Vihar in Kota.
- For this, 3200 square meters of land has been allotted and its estimated cost is ₹20 crore.
- This centre will be helpful in research and public awareness on the social, literary and spiritual contributions of Sant Kabir.
- Students and researchers will be able to study his life and literature in depth.
- Context: Sant Kabir Academy is already operational in Magahar, Uttar Pradesh.

Translocation of blackbucks for the first time in the country - Jaswantgarh (Rajasthan).

- A mini sanctuary has been developed over 450 hectares in Jaswantgarh Tal area near Sujangarh, Rajasthan.
- So far, 22 blackbucks have been successfully transferred using the Boma technique; The goal is to transfer 100 blackbucks.
- The area is about 15 km from Tal Chhapar Sanctuary (Churu) and is considered to be an extension of it.
- This is the country's first blackbuck relocation drive.

India's first 'Cow Safari' - Hingonia Goshala, Jaipur

- The country's first 'Cow Safari' will be launched at Hingonia Goshala in Jaipur.
- Visitors will be able to see cows of 17 indigenous breeds of the country; At present, there are 7 breeds (Tharparkar, Kankrej, Sanchori, Mewati, Nagori, Rathi, Gir).
- Arrangements have been made for cow circumambulation, bullock cart facility, and movement in natural surroundings.
- The objective of the project is to conserve cows and spread public awareness.

Rifle and Machine Gun Manufacturing Plant in Rajasthan

- MoUs worth more than Rs 1500 crore have been approved.

- The gun parts will be manufactured in Jodhpur and Jaipur, while the barrel will be manufactured in the Boranada Industrial Area (Jodhpur).
- The final assembly will be in a confidential, secure place.

Major Products

- 1. Military Grade Sniper Rifle: Sub-MOA Accuracy, 1000 Effective hitting to the yard.
- 2. Multi-Barrel Machine Gun ☐ 6000 rounds per minute firing capacity, up to 15000 rounds fired from a single bullet.

Robotic hernia surgery for the first time at SMS Hospital, Jaipur

- For the first time, Pantaloon Hernia surgery was successfully performed with robotic technology at Sawai Mansingh (SMS) Hospital, Jaipur.
- This is the first robotic surgery in a government hospital in the state.
- Usually this operation is done by conventional or laparoscopic method, but this time an advanced robotic method was adopted.

Rajasthan's first LNG station at Neemrana

- The state's first LNG (Liquefied Natural Gas) station is being set up in Neemrana by Rajasthan State Gas.
- It will be fitted with two storage tanks with a capacity of 56 kilolitres each and an LNG dispenser.
- The total cost has been fixed at around ₹15 crore.

Proposal to convert Siliserh lake into Ramsar site ready

- A proposal has been prepared to declare Siliserh Lake of Rajasthan as a Ramsar site.
- The lake is home to more than 150 native and exotic bird species.
- The proposal has been sent to the government after meeting all the necessary criteria.

Three major institutes of sports sector will be developed in Jaipur

- 1. Multipurpose Divisional Level Stadium
 - It will be set up in an area of 7.66 hectares in Badi Ka Kheda of Bagru.
- 2. Maharana Pratap Sports University (Achrol Region)
 - Area: 1.94 lakh sqm.
 - Courses: Degree/Diploma in Physical Education, Sports Science, Sports Psychology, Sports Management.



- Facilities: Stadium, gym, lab, hostel, and research center.
- This will be the first sports university in Rajasthan that will provide teaching, coaching and research at one place.

3. Sports College (Near SMS stadium)

- In 2023, the High Performance Sports Training and Rehab Centre was established at the SMS Stadium.
- Objective: Injury recovery and fitness assessment of players.

Nakki Lake gets Notified Area Status

- The famous Nakki Lake at Mount Abu has been declared as a notified area.
- This decision was taken by the Self-Government Department on the recommendation of the Rajasthan Lake Development Authority.
- Now this lake has come under the category of Highly Protected Area, which will prevent haphazard construction and natural damage.

Albert Hall Museum to become Smart Museum

- The Rajasthan government has approved a Rs 25-crore project of the tourism department, which aims at digitisation of museums and forts in the state.
- The Albert Hall Museum in Jaipur will be converted into a smart museum.
- It will use AR (Augmented Reality), RFID tagging, virtual tours, digital light and sound shows, interactive displays, VR and AI technologies.

Establishment of Stone Park in Bundi

- A stone park will be set up in Kachhaliya village, Taleda tehsil of Bundi district.
- For this, 47.07 hectares of land will be allotted to RIICO.
- This has been announced in the state budget 2025-26.
- Only non-polluting units will be set up here.
- It aims to provide an organized platform to mineral-based industries, employment to youth and promote industrial investment.

International Level All Weather Swimming Pool in Jaipur

- This pool is being developed under the Rajasthan State Sports Council at Chaugan Stadium, Jaipur.
- The project is under the Smart City Mission, with an estimated cost of over ₹16 crore.
- The pool will be built as per international standards, with a depth of 4 to 8 feet.

Rajasthan's first Paediatric CTVS Unit

- Rajasthan's first paediatric cardiothoracic and vascular surgery (CTVS) unit has been set up at JK Lon Hospital in Jaipur.
- In this, holistic treatment of diseases related to children shearts will be possible.
 - The facility will be available to treat serious conditions ranging from heart failure to a hole in the heart.
- This unit has been set up under the Rashtriya Bal Swasthya Karyakram (RBSK),
- A budget of about Rs 15 crore was approved for this.
- The unit will have 80 beds, including 10 ICUs, 6 HDUs and 65 general beds.
- In addition, it also has state-of-the-art cath labs, modular operation theatres and advanced robotic cath labs.
- This is for the first time in Rajasthan that such a high-level cardiac treatment facility for children has been started in any government or private institution.

Residential Girls Sports Institute

- The Rajasthan government will start Residential Girls Sports Institutes in 3 districts

 ☐ Jaipur, Udaipur and Bharatpur.
- The initiative is being undertaken under Mission Olympics 2028.
- The scheme was announced by Finance Minister Diya Kumari in her budget speech.
- Each institute will include 100 girl players.
- Eligibility:
 - O Unmarried and girls in the age group of 14 to 20 years.
 - Must be a native of Rajasthan.
- The state government has approved a budget of ₹75 crore for these institutions .

- This Jain temple is located in Mandawala village of Ummedabad area of Jalore district.
- The architecture of the temple resembles the shape of a ship.

- The award was presented by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare on 20 June 2025 in New Delhi.
- The ☑Tobacco Free Youth Campaign 2.0☑ was started in the state from 24 September 2024, under which public awareness programs were organized up to the village level.
- As many as 14,725 awareness programmes were conducted under the Tobacco Free Learning Institutions campaign.

Shruti Bhardwaj wins ⊠Achiever of the Year⊠ Award

- The Rajasthan Co-operative Dairy Federation (RCDF) received this honour for its outstanding work in the green energy sector.
- The award was presented by Energy Minister Hiralal Nagar at the Green Energy Conclave on 7 June 2025.
- The award was given to Shruti Bhardwaj for her leadership in:
 - Achieving Profit of more than ₹400 crore.
 - o Turnover of ₹10,000 crore,
 - Outstanding contributions to green energy.
- This is considered to be the biggest achievement in RCDF⊠s 47-year history.

MoUs/ Agreements

Free medical facility for helpless and unknown patients

- A joint MoU has been signed between the Department of Social Justice and Empowerment and the Department of Medical Education.
- Under this, mentally disabled, deprived, abandoned and unknown patients will get free treatment.
- The cost of treatment will be borne by the Rajasthan Medical Services Corporation Limited (RMRS).
- Patients brought by registered charitable trusts or NGOs will be treated free of cost in hospitals.
- It will be mandatory to provide proof of the helpless condition of the concerned patient by the trust or NGO.
- A joint committee will authorise and provide assistance to trusts and institutions.



Various Environmental Agreements

1. Climate Change Adaptation Plan 2030

- MoU between the State Pollution Control Board and the Centre for Science and Environment (CSE), New Delhi.
- Objective: To prepare an Adaptation Plan 2030 to deal with the effects of climate change in Rajasthan.

2. Emission Trading Scheme (ETS)

- Tripartite MoU on 5 June 2025 between Department of Environment & Climate Change, State Pollution Control Board, and J.P.A.L. S.A., E.P.I.C.
- Objective: To implement the Emission Trading Scheme, thereby making it possible to control industrial pollution.

Sports

Asia Cup 2025 (Archery): Sachin Chechi won bronze medal

- In the Asia Cup 2025 held in Singapore, Sachin Chechi of Rajasthan received the bronze medal.
- He defeated Hemu Bachchar of Bangladesh with a score of 148-146.
- President of Rajasthan Archery Association: Deep Singh Khangarot.

Abhijeet Gupta becomes Delhi GM Open Chess Champion for the fourth time

- Bhilwara Grandmaster Abhijeet Gupta won the 21st Delhi Grandmasters Open Chess Tournament title.
- This is his fourth title in this competition (Former winners: 2008, 2014, 2020).
- He scored a total of 8.5 points after playing a draw with Aronyak Ghosh in the final round.
- He is the only Grandmaster from Rajasthan and has been awarded the Arjuna Award in 2013.
- Abhijeet is the first player to become a champion 5 times in Commonwealth Chess.

Rajasthan wins 34th Senior National Wushu Championship

- The competition was held at Poornima University, Jaipur.
- Organizers: Indian Wushu Association and Rajasthan Wushu Association.
- Rajasthan won the overall championship by winning a total of 24 medals (10 gold, 8 silver, 6 bronze).

- The Government of India has included Nagori Pan Methi, the traditional spice crop of Nagaur (Rajasthan), as the 53rd spice in the list of Spices Board.
- It has been recognized through a gazette notification.
- This crop can now be included in exportimport through APEDA and other government agencies by issuing HS code.

Rajasthan Runway Fest (14–22 June 2025, Jaipur Airport)

- For the first time, Rajasthan Runway Fest was organized at Jaipur International Airport.
- Aim: To promote the folk art, cultural heritage and traditional cuisine of Rajasthan.
- The nine-day extravaganza, held at Terminal 2, featured stalls of puppetry, Ghoomar, folk music and Rajasthani cuisine.
- The festival provides a new platform to the fading folk arts.

Use of AI technology for the first time in Mineral Exploration (Rajasthan)

- The Rajasthan government has initiated the use of AI technology to modernize and make mineral exploration more scientific.
- This pilot project is being implemented in **Bhilwara**, **Bharatpur and Chittorgarh** districts.



- The State Mineral Exploration Trust will do this work in collaboration with the Central Government and private investigating agencies.
- Drilling will be done on priority in potential mineral areas based on AI analysis.
- This initiative will improve the quality of mineral exploration with saving of time, cost and labour.

Rajasthan's first Electric Double-Decker Boat

- On 7 June 2025, Rajasthan's first electric double-decker luxury boat was inaugurated at Pichola Lake in Udaipur.
- This boat is based on modern pontoon technology, which keeps it safe even in storm-like conditions.
- A maximum of 25 passengers are allowed to sit in the boat.

Pt. Deendayal Upadhyaya Antyodaya Sambal Pakhwada (24th June 9th July 2025)

- This fortnight will be organized through camps at Gram Panchayat level.
- Objective: To provide the direct benefits of government schemes to the general public.

• Key Services:

- Distribution of Ownership Leases
- Disposal of Stone Quarrying and Boundary related cases
- Soil Sample Collection and Soil Health Card Distribution
- o Disposal of pending NFSA cases
- Identification of newly eligible families through Aadhaar seeding
- The Collector will be designated as the nodal officer in each district.

Allocation of 4,000 MW Hour Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) to Rajasthan

- The Ministry of Power, Government of India, made this allocation to Rajasthan under the Viability Gap Funding (VGF).
- Central assistance of ₹720 crore (₹18 lakh per MWh) will be given for 4,000 MWh BESS
- This will conserve solar and wind energy and use it as per the requirement.
- This will ensure grid stability, supply in non-solar times and energy availability during peak loads.
- Rajasthan has got this share for the development of 30 GW of capacity across the country.

Construction of 45,000 water Conservation Structures in Rajasthan

- The Rajasthan government launched the ⊠Karmabhoomi Se Mathrubhumi⊠ campaign, in which the participation of migrant Rajasthani citizens is being ensured.
- In the next 4 years, 45,000 water conservation structures (stepwells, johads, ponds, wells, etc.) will be constructed.
- In FY 2025-26, each district aims to have at least 125 structures, totalling around 5,000 structures.
- As much as 72% of the state's area falls in the ⊠over-exploited category, where there is a high dependence on groundwater.
- This effort is in line with the Central Government⊠sWater Harvesting Campaigns such as ⊠Catch the Rain⊠.

For the first time in Homeopathy, Super Specialty Services and D.M. syllabus

- The National Commission for Homoeopathy has released the draft of ⊠Homoeopathy Super Speciality and DM Regulations, 2025⊠.
- DM (Doctorate of Medicine) courses will start in government medical institutions from July 2026.
- Course Structure: Three years DM course (Part I, II, III), each part of 12 months, maximum of 6 years.

Relaxation in norms for formation of Village Service Cooperative Societies

- As per the budget announcement of the Government of Rajasthan, Gram Sewa Cooperative Societies are being formed in all the Gram Panchayats.
- The state government has relaxed the parameters by up to 50%:
 - The minimum number of members is 150.
 - The minimum sharing amount will be ₹1.50 lakh.
- Committees in tribal areas will be formed with the help of Van Dhan Vikas Kendras.
- So far, 118 new committees have been established.

BITS Mesra claims to have discovered the course of Saraswati river

- Scientists from BITS Mesra, Ranchi have discovered the possible downstream of the lost Saraswati river in Rajasthan.
- Study area: About 3.70 lakh sq. km.

• Stream 1:

- o Origin: Anupgarh (from Ghaggar River)
- o Route: Beriyawali → Behala → Tanot → Jaisalmer
- o End: Arab Sea.



Stream 2:

 Joins the first stream meeting near Bahala and Satto (Jaisalmer).

• Other Supporting Streams:

- It passed through Dhapur, Jaisalmer, Barmer, Bikaner, Hanumangarh, Churu, Jhunjhunu districts.
- These streams met the main stream near Mohangarh and Suratgarh.
- Note: The water source at Mohangarh was confirmed during excavation last year.
- According to scientists, water from Indus, Jhelum and Chenab rivers could be transported through these ancient routes.

9 laboratories in Rajasthan certified internationally

- 9 laboratories of Rajasthan State Pollution Control Board were certified by NABL as per ISO/IEC 17025:2017 standards.
- In these laboratories, air, water, sound and soil will be tested to international standards.

Flipkart gets NBFC license

- Flipkart is the first major e-commerce company in India to get an NBFC (Non-Banking Financial Company) license from the RBI.
- This license allows direct lending to customers and vendors.
- The company will now expand financial services through its FinTech app super money.
- Flipkart is currently owned by Walmart.
- NBFC companies give loans, but cannot accept deposits.
- They operate under the RBI Act, 1934.

Dhruv Policy: Digital Address System

- The Government of India through the Department of Posts released the Dhruva Policy Document.
- Its purpose is to create a standardized and geo-coded digital address system.
- This policy is based on the DIGIPIN initiative.
- It aims to make digital addresses a part of national digital infrastructure like Aadhaar and UPI.

• Highlights:

- Address standardization to address regional variations.
- o Address management under the Address-as-a-Service (AaaS) model.
- Facilitates user control and customization of digital addresses.
- Design for interoperability in government, e-commerce, logistics, and financial services.

Establishment of AI University

- MoU between Andhra Pradesh government and American company Nvidia.
- An Artificial Intelligence University will be set up in the state.
- In the next two years, 10,000 engineering students will be imparted AI-related skills.

Ladakh: Amendment to Reservation and Language Laws (Ordinance by President)

- President Droupadi Murmu promulgated ordinances to amend the rules governing the Union Territory of Ladakh.
- Ladakh does not have a legislative assembly, so the President has executive powers.

Key Modifications:

- Reservation in government jobs: The reservation limit for SC, ST and OBC was fixed at a maximum of 85%.
- Domicile Policy: 15 years of continuous residency required to get a domicile (counting from 2019).
- People settled after 2019 will not be considered domiciles until 2034.
- Women's reservation: 33% women's reservation in Ladakh Autonomous Hill Council implemented for the first time.
- o Official languages: Now the official languages of Ladakh will be ⊠ English, Hindi, Urdu, Bhoti, and Purgi.

- This 701 km long road connects Mumbai and Nagpur.
- With this expressway, the journey from Mumbai to Nagpur can now be completed in just 7 hours.
- The project aims to ensure fast and safe commuting between the commercial and winter capitals of the state.

- The first tri-services all-women sailing team of the Indian Armed Forces withdrew from Seychelles on 4 June 2025.
- The team completed an international voyage of 1,800 nautical miles on board the indigenous 56-feet long boat 'Triveni'.
- It was India's first international level allwomen open-sea sailing mission.

Introduction of Bhartiya Bhasha Anubhag (BBA)

- On 6th June 2025, Home Minister Amit Shah launched the Bharatiya Bhasha Anubhag (BBA) in New Delhi.
- Objective: To promote the use of Indian languages in government work and to reduce the influence of foreign languages.
- A budgetary provision of ₹56 crore (2024– 25) was made for this purpose.
- C-DAC was given the responsibility of technological development.
- It will promote dialogue between the central and state governments in Indian languages.

Census of India 2025 - Notification Released

- The Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) released the notification of Census 2025 on 16th June 2025.
- It will be India's first digital and caste-based census, which will end by March 1, 2027.
- The data obtained after 2026 will be used in delimitation, women's reservation and policy-making.

- The mobile app will include the option of real-time data entry and self-enumeration.
- On April 30, 2025, the central government approved the caste-based census.
- This data will be helpful for social justice, reservation policies, and targeted government schemes.

Two stages of the process:

1. House Listing Operation (HLO):

 Collection of information related to houses, property, electricity, water, toilets etc.

2. Population Enumeration (PE):

• Social, economic, cultural, and caste information of the person.

Operation 'Sindhu'

- An operation launched by the Government of India with an aim to evacuate Indian citizens and students stranded in Iran amid the Iran-Israel conflict.
- Evacuation route: from Iran via Armenia.
- The operation is part of India's series of international evacuation missions.

• Other major evacuation missions:

- Operation Ganga: Evacuation of Indians during the Ukraine War.
- Operation Kaveri: Assisting Indians in Sudan crisis.
- Vande Bharat Mission: Return of citizens from different countries during COVID-19.

Bihar: India's first mobile-based e-voting system

- Bihar has become the first state in India to implement e-voting through a mobile app.
- This system will be used in the municipal elections on 28 June 2025.
- Announcement: By Bihar State Election Commissioner Deepak Prasad.

Highlights:

• Voters will be able to cast their votes through the mobile app without going to the polling station.

Operating through two apps:

- 1. \boxtimes e-Voting SECBHR \boxtimes Developed by: C-DAC
- 2. Another app of Bihar State Election Commission
- This system will be especially useful for migrant workers, differently-abled people, pregnant women, senior citizens and seriously ill voters.



Puducherry: 19th Legislature to adopt 'NeVA' platform

- The Puducherry Legislative Assembly achieved the distinction of becoming the 19th Legislature of India by adopting the National e-Vidhan Application (NeVA).
- The NeVA project aims to make legislative processes digital and paperless.
- It is 100% funded by the Central Government and is being implemented by the Ministry of Parliamentary Affairs.






