#### 4. Assessment Criteria

- Evaluate for clarity, coherence, conciseness, relevance, and consistency.
- Deduct marks for missing examples, poor presentation, or illegible handwriting.
- Answers with relevant context well-aligned components (intro, body, and conclusion) should score around 60% of the total marks.

#### 5. General Guidelines

- Focus more on communicating ideas effectively; grammatical errors can be overlooked if the content is clear.
- Draw inspiration from well-written answers of other aspirants but avoid copying their style completely.
