

Muharram

Imam Hussain was martyred in this month in the battle of Karbala. Month of mourning: The first month of the Islamic lunar calendar. About: Considered one of the four sacred months in Islam, during **Muharram** which warfare and conflicts are "Forbidden" in Arabic, signifying traditionally prohibited. the sacred nature of this month. Literal meaning: Marks the beginning (first month) of the Islamic New Year. Significance: Second holiest month after Ramzan.

Ashura

	About:	The tenth day of Muharram and the most significant day in the month.	
Ashura	Shia Muslims:	They commemorate martyrdom of Prophet Mohammed's grandson, Imam Hussain, killed in the Battle of Karbala. Shia Muslims observe mourning rituals, including self-flagellation, chest-beating, etc. 'Taziya', a tableaux procession is also held by the Shia Community.	
	Sunni Muslims:	Ashura marks the day when Prophet Moses and the Children of Israel were saved from Pharaoh's tyranny by crossing the Red Sea.	


- 4. Battle of Karbala The Hindu
- Started: On the 10th day of Muharram in 680 CE (Ashura).
- Fought between: Yazid, a tyrant who had usurped the Muslim caliphate and Imam Hussain, grandson of the Prophet Muhammad with the help of his daughter Fatima and her husband Imam Ali.

6. What is causing widespread rainfall across India? - Indian Express

Context

For the first time this season, the southwest monsoon is active over a large geographical area of India. At least 80% of the country last week reported widespread rainfall, with heavy to very heavy spells lashing Assam, West Bengal, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Gujarat, coastal Maharashtra and Karnataka, Kerala, and Lakshadweep.

Factors responsible for widespread rains

Continuous incoming of moisture-laden strong westerly winds from the Arabian Sea.

between Pakistan & Bay of Bengal during the monsoon season which usually oscillates between north and south within the season. Whenever it moves towards south, more rainfall can take place in central, eastern and peninsular India. When it shifts towards north, the Himalayan foothills are likely to receive more rainfall but the rest of India sees a drop in rainfall.

It is a semi-permanent, low-pressure area

Position of monsoon trough:

Persistence of an off-shore trough:

It is a shallow trough of low pressure, which develops along India's coast during the monsoon between south Gujarat and north Kerala for more than a week now.

Intermittent development of a wind shear zone:

The region where winds move with different velocities and directions along latitudes 20 ° N between central and peninsular India.

7. Political representation of women - The Hindu

Context

In the recently concluded general elections in the U.K., a record 263 women MPs (40%) have been elected to the House of Commons. The South African National Assembly has around 45% women representation, while the U.S. House of Representatives has 29%. New Zealand was the first to grant universal women suffrage in 1893. The U.K., provided all its women the right to vote in 1928. The U.S., granted equal voting rights through the nineteenth amendment only in 1920.

Women representatives in independent India

• Universal adult suffrage in India: India provided the right to vote for all its

women right from the first general elections in 1952.

• Representation of women in Lok Sabha & State legislative assemblies: The percentage of women in the Lok Sabha stands at 14% in the 18th Lok Sabha. The representation in State Legislative Assemblies is even poorer with the national average being around 9%.

Methods to ensure higher representation of women

- Voluntary or legislated compulsory quotas for candidates within political parties
- **Quota in parliament** through reservation of seats.
- Quotas within political parties

106th amendment/ Nari Shakti Vandan Adhiniyam

- **About:** It provided for one-third reservation of seats for women in the Lok Sabha and State legislative assemblies.
- Importance:
 - This would ensure a fair representation of women in legislatures
 - It would increase gender sensitivity in parliamentary processes and legislation.
 - It would also hopefully increase the number of women Ministers in the Centre and States.

8. What does Maharashtra's Public Security Bill stipulate? - The Hindu

Context

Recently, the state government tabled the Maharashtra Special Public Security (MSPS) Act, 2024 to curb the 'menace of Naxalism' in urban areas.

Maharashtra Special Public Security (MSPS) bill, 2024

Maharashtra Special Public Security (MSPS) bill, 2024					
About:	It allows the State to declare any organisation as 'unlawful' with offences categorised as cognisable and non-bailable.				
Rationale:	The state Govt stated that naxalism is not limited to rural areas, but is increasing in urban areas through frontal organisations. Such unlawful groups 'propagate their ideology of armed rebellion against the constitutional mandate and disrupt public order in the State.				
Difference from UAPA:	This law empowers the state to classify organisations as 'unlawful associations.' But, in MSPS Act, an advisory board of three persons who are qualified to be appointed as judges of High Court shall oversee the confirmation process, while under UAPA, a tribunal led by a High Court judge verifies the State's declaration.				
	Empowers the State to designate any suspected 'organisation' as an 'unlawful organisation'.				
	Outlines four offences for which a person may be penalised:	being a member of an unlawful organisation,			
Key provisions:		being a member and raises funds for an unlawful organisation or harbours any member of the unlawful organisation,			
		whoever manages or assists in the management of an unlawful organisation, or promotes or assists in promoting a meeting,			
		whoever commits or abets or attempts to commit or plans to commit any unlawful activity.			
Term of punishment:	Ranging from two to seven years, along with fines between ₹2 lakh and ₹5 lakh.

9. IPEF: India likely to sign clean, fair economy pacts - The Hindu

Context

India is likely to soon be able to sign the clean economy and fair economy agreements under the U.S.-led IPEF. However, it is not yet ready to join the trade pillar of IPEF as it continues to be uncomfortable with some of its components, such as framing of high-standard rules on digital economy, including cross-border data flows and data localisation, and labour and environment issues

Indo Pacific Economic Framework for Prosperity (IPEF)

- **About:** A US-led initiative to strengthen economic partnership among participating countries to enhance resilience, sustainability, inclusiveness, economic growth, fairness, and competitiveness in the Indo-Pacific region.
- Launch: 2021
- **Nature:** Not a Free Trade Agreement (FTA) but allows members to negotiate the parts they want to.
- 4 main "pillars":
 - Supply-chain resilience
 - Clean energy, decarbonisation & infrastructure
 - Taxation & anti-corruption
 - Fair & resilient trade.
- 14 IPEF partners: Australia, Brunei Darussalam, Fiji, India, Indonesia, Japan, Republic of Korea, Malaysia, New Zealand, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, the United States, and Viet Nam

Difference between IPEF & Other Trade Deals

- Not exactly a trade pact: The provision of multiple pillars does entail an option for participants to choose what they want to be a part of.
- Not a take-it-or-leave-it arrangement: But most multilateral trade deals are.



10. Sebi's proposed 'new asset class': How will investors gain from it? - Indian Express

Context

The Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi) has outlined plans to introduce a 'new asset class' which will offer investment products that lie between mutual funds (MFS) and portfolio management services (PMS). This new category of products, to be introduced under the MF structure, will have a minimum in-vestment limit of Rs 10 lakh.

New asset class

About:	A new product category aimed at bridging the gap between MFs and PMS in terms of flexibility in portfolio construction.				
Aim:	To fill the gap between MFs and PMS by offering a regulated product featuring greater flexibility, higher risk- taking capability, and a higher ticket size to meet the needs of the emerging category of investors.				
Minimum investment limit:	It has been proposed at Rs 10 lakh per investor within the asset management company (AMC)/MF.				
Investment strategies:	Long-Short Equity Fund:	A fund that seeks to deliver retums by taking long and short posi- tions in equity and equity-related instruments. For example, the fund may be bullish on the automobile sector and bearish on the IT sector, investing in both by go- ing long on the automobile sec- tor and short on the IT sector.			
	Inverse ETF/Fund:	A fund that seeks to generate returns that are negatively correlated to the returns of the underlying in- dex.			
Benefits:	It will be able to take exposure to derivatives for purposes other than hedging and portfolio rebalancing.				
	This will provide more flexibility and risk- taking in investments and potentially generate higher returns.






11. Periyar Tiger Reserve - The Hindu

- Location: Western Ghats of Kerala.
- **Designation:** It was designated as Tiger Reserve in 1978.
- Rivers: Mullayar and Periyar
- 6 major tribal communities: Mannans, Paliyans, Malayarayans, Mala Pandarams, Uralis and Ulladans
- **Terrain:** Hilly and undulating with a maximum altitude of 2016 m.
- Vegetation: Tropical evergreen, semi- evergreen and moist deciduous.
- Flora: Teak, mangoes, rosewood, jamun, jacarandas, terminalias, tamarind, royal ponciana, bamboo etc.
- Fauna: Elephants, Wild Pigs,
 Sambar, Gaur, Mouse Deer, lion-tailed macaque, Nilgiri Langur, Gee's Golden Langur, Common Langur and Bonnet Macaque.

- **Program:** It is the second scheduled flight of the Artemis program and the first crewed Artemis mission.
- **Mechanism:** It will use the huge Space Launch System (SLS) mega-rocket and Orion spacecraft to launch the crew on the lunar flyby mission.



Artemis Program

- **About:** A NASA's program to return astronauts to the Moon, preparing the way for human missions to Mars.
- **Aim:** To "land the first woman and first person of colour on the Moon", explore the lunar surface.
- Components: Construction of the Lunar Gateway space station in orbit around the Moon.




