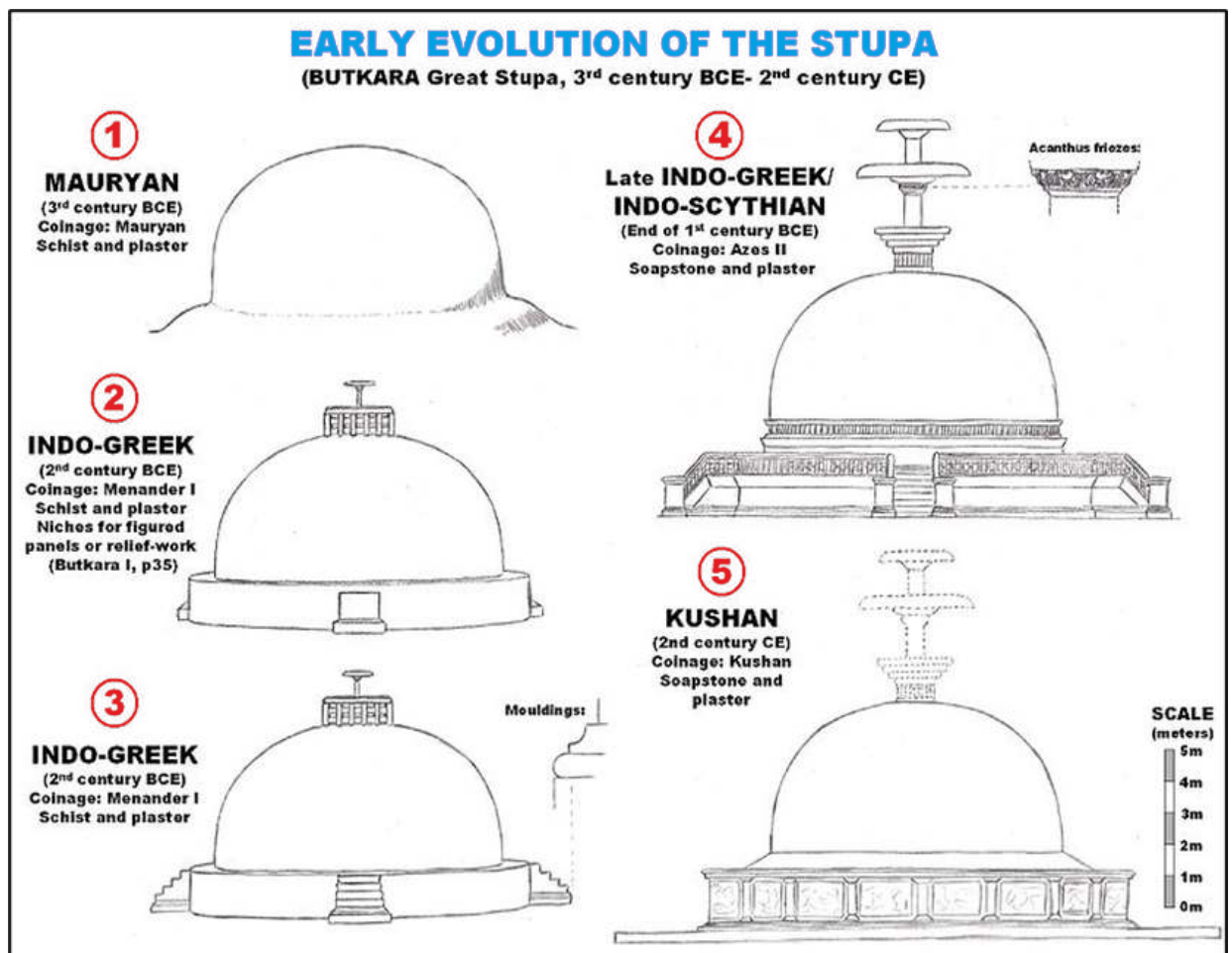

1.From Ashokan times to now, Sanchi to Europe, story of the Great Stupa – Indian Express

Context >>

External Affairs Minister recently stopped by the replica of the East Gate of Sanchi's Great Stupa standing in front of Humboldt Forum museum in Berlin. The ornate red sandstone gateway, which was unveiled in December 2022, is a 1:1 reproduction of the original structure standing at almost 10 metres high and 6 metres wide, and weighing roughly 150 tonnes.

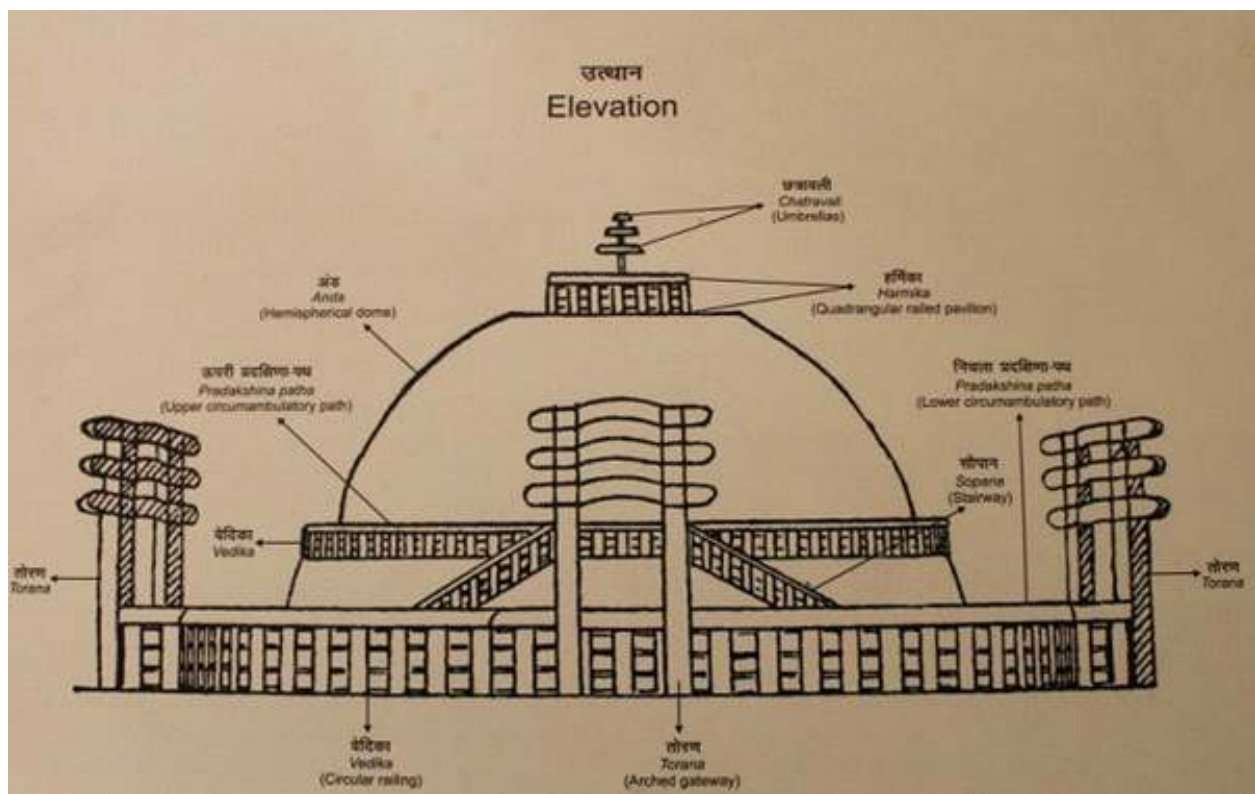


- **Meaning:** In Buddhism, a stupa is a mound-like or hemispherical structure that contains relics (typically of Buddha or Buddhist monks/nuns) and is used for meditation.
- **Origin:** Pre-Buddhist burial mounds in ancient India, originally non-religious memorials.

- **Development:**

- **Ashoka's Expansion (250 BCE):** Emperor Ashoka is believed to have built 84,000 stupas across India to distribute Buddha's relics.
 - **Decorated Stupas (125 BCE onwards):** Stupas became richly decorated with sculptural reliefs, examples include Bharhut, Bodh Gaya, and Sanchi.
 - **Gandhara Development (3rd century BCE – 5th century CE):** Influenced the spread of Buddhism to Central Asia, China, Korea, and Japan; Gandharan stupas shaped the design of Buddhist architecture.
- **Significance:** The stupa design influenced temple architecture, such as the Mahabodhi Temple in Bodh Gaya.

Sanchi Stupa »



- **Construction:** Commissioned in the 3rd century BCE by Emperor Ashoka, the oldest stone structure in India. Last construction dated to the 12th century CE, after which the site was abandoned.
- **About:** Built over the relics of Buddha and his disciples Sariputra and Maudgalyayan.
- **Rediscovery:** By British General Henry Taylor in 1818; formal excavation led by Alexander Cunningham in 1851.

- Restoring: ASI director-general John Marshall in the 1910s with funding from the Bhopal begums.
- Designation: A UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1989.
- Location: Sanchi Town, Raisen District, Madhya Pradesh.
- Gateways/ Toranas of the Great Stupa:
 - Original stupa was a plain hemispherical structure with a chhatra (parasol).
 - Four ornamental gateways (toranas) oriented to the cardinal directions were added in the 1st century BCE during the Satavahana reign.
 - Gateways feature sculptures depicting scenes from Buddha's life and stories from the Jataka tales.

In alignment with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, to impart education in the Indian languages for an improved understanding and improved teaching-learning outcome, the government has initiated technical education, including engineering and medicine in Indian languages.

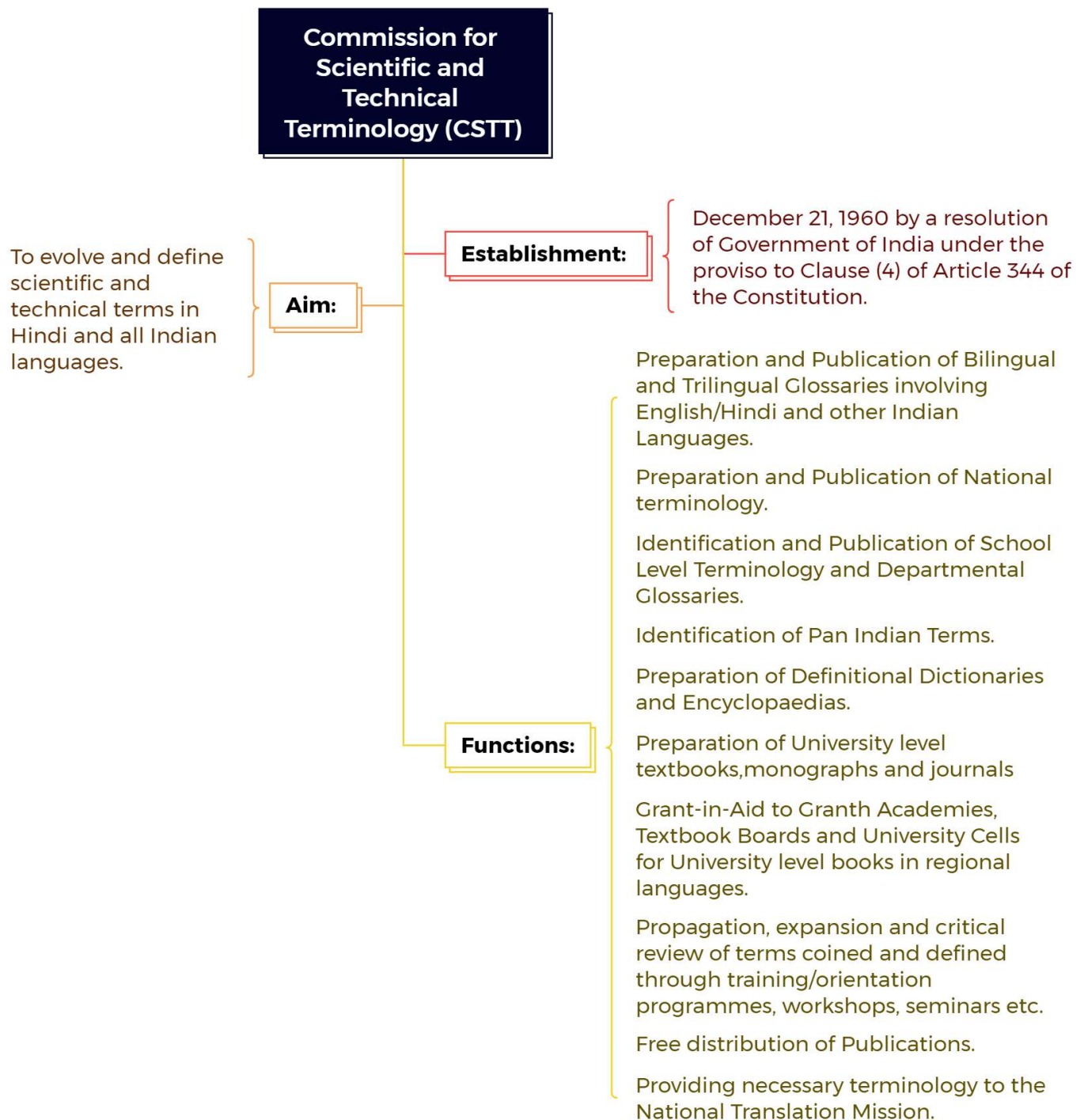
Shabd ('shabd.education.gov.in') Portal »

- **Aim:** To be a central repository for all the terminologies prepared for Indian languages.
- **Hosting content:** Glossaries of CSTT, other institutions or agencies having such dictionaries are also able to host their work in digital form.
- **Current content:** 450 dictionaries with three million words.
- **Significance:**
 - The users will be able to search the equivalent terms of scientific and technical terminology in Indian languages.
 - They will be able to register their feedback for the equivalents already prepared by the CSTT.
 - The user will have various options for search, whether based on languages, subjects, dictionary type, or language pairs.
 - Not only this, the user can choose to search in a specific glossary or through the entire collection.
 - Assumes significance amid efforts to provide technical education, including in medicine and engineering, in Indian languages.

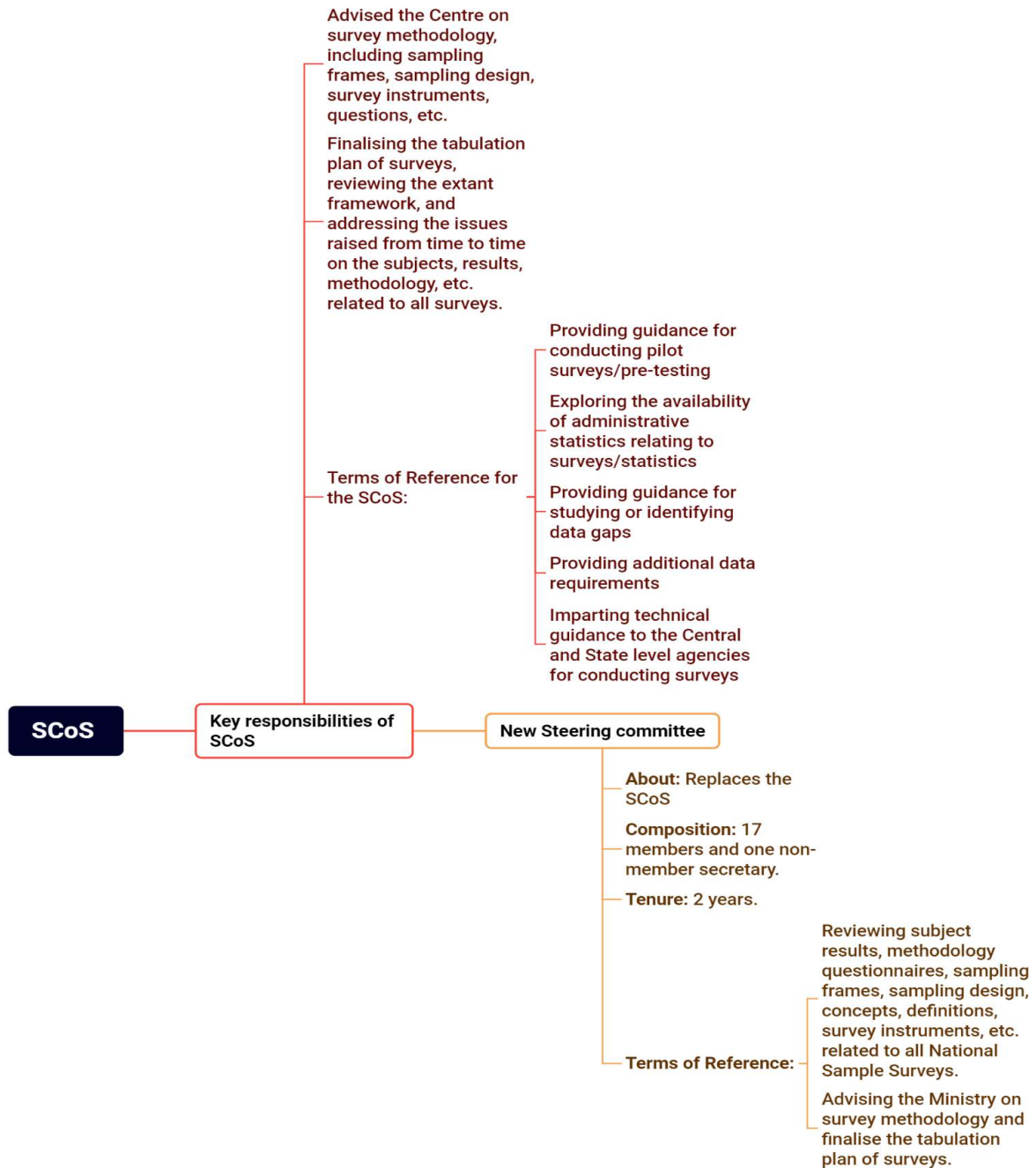

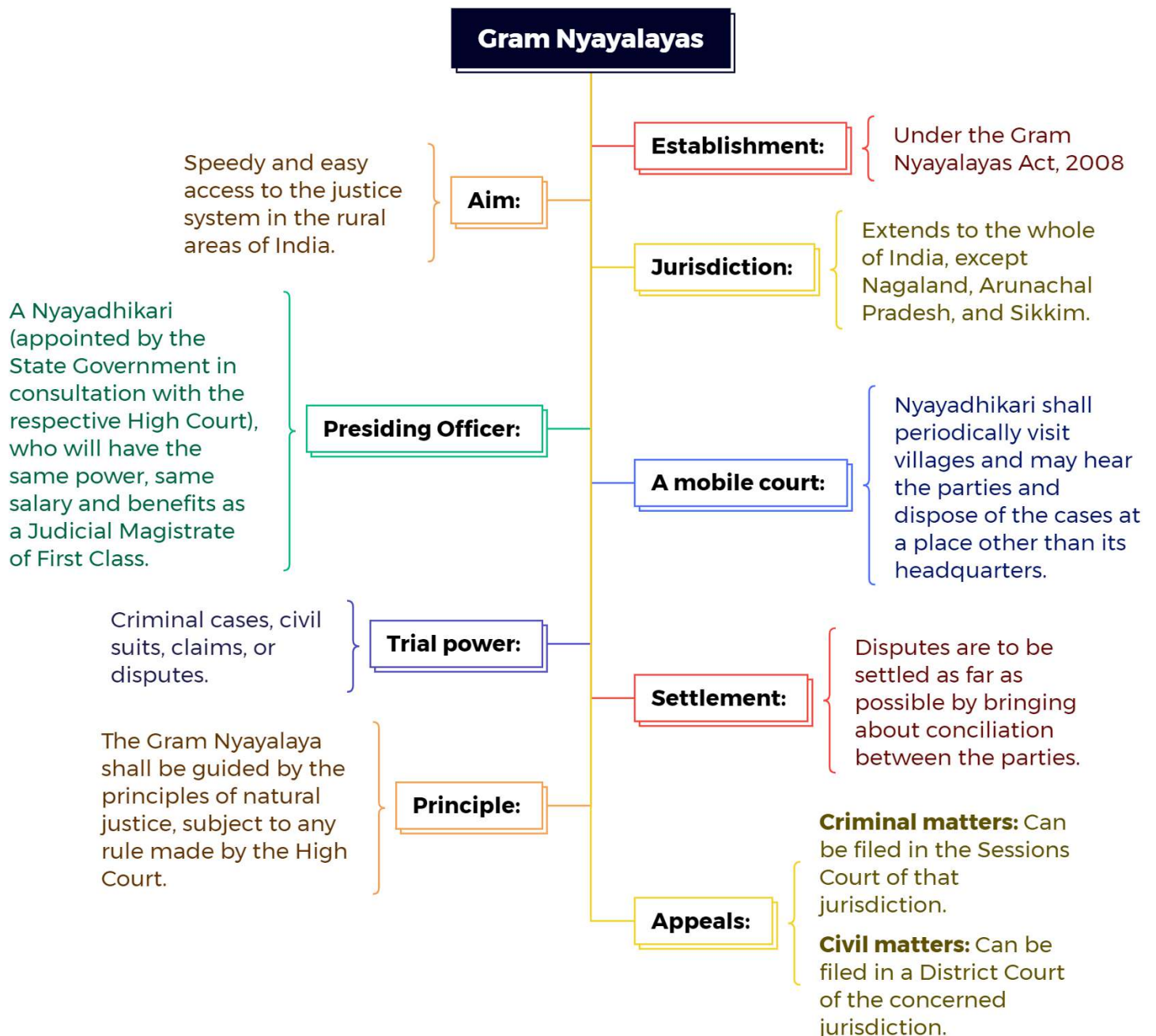


4. Gram Nyayalayas – The Hindu

5. Mithun spotted in Assam for first time – Indian Express

Context »

Bovine animal Mithun has been spotted in Assam for the first time, Assam chief minister said recently.

- **Scientific Name:** Bos frontalis
- **About:** A heavily built, semi-domesticated bovine species which is the state animal of Arunachal Pradesh and Nagaland.
- **Origin:** Originated more than 8000 years ago and is considered to be a descendant of wild Indian gaur or bison.
- **Distribution in India:** North Eastern (NE) region of India, with Arunachal Pradesh having the highest population.
- **Global distribution:** Southeast Asia, viz., Bangladesh, Myanmar, and Bhutan.
- **IUCN Red List Status:** Vulnerable
- **CITES Status:** Appendix I



6. Ahaetulla Longirostris – Indian Express

Context »

A new species of snake with a remarkably long snout has been discovered in India, marking an exciting addition to the country's rich biodiversity. The species, named the long-snouted vine snake (Ahaetulla Longirostris), was identified after two specimens were found in vastly different regions, Bihar in the eastern part of the country and Meghalaya in the northeastern region.

Long-snouted vine snake/ Ahaetulla Longirostris »

- **About:** A new snake species with a remarkably long snout.
- **Appearance:**
 - Has slender, elongated body and striking colouration.
 - Can grow up to 4 feet in length
 - Typically bright green or orange-brown, with an orange belly.
 - Its head of this snake is triangular.



7. India's second largest butterfly species found in Madurai - The Hindu

Context »

India's second largest butterfly species, Southern Birdwing, has been found on the satellite campus of The American College between Chathirapatti and Kadavur on New Natham Highway in Madurai district.

How cholera affects the body

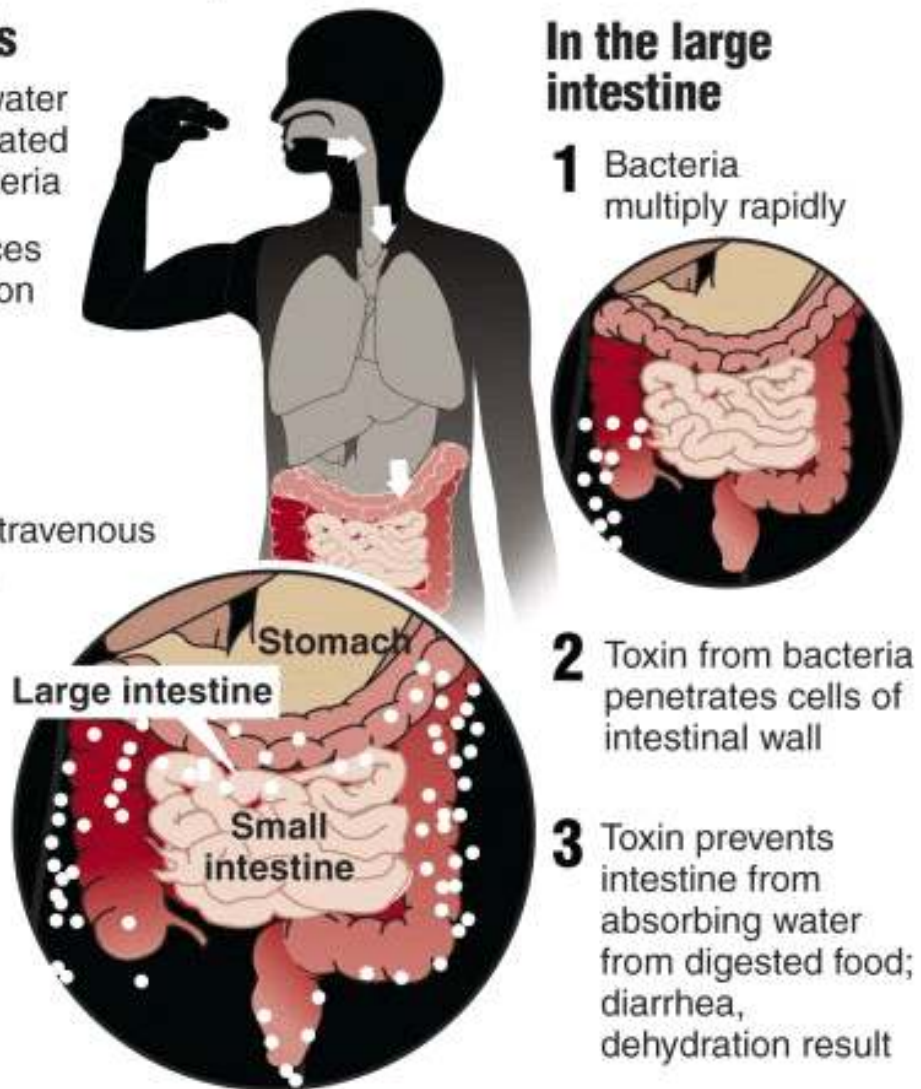
Cholera is an acute intestinal infection that causes severe diarrhea, dehydration and, if not treated promptly, death.

How it spreads

- People ingest water or food contaminated with cholera bacteria
- In epidemic, feces of diseased person is source of contamination

Treatment

- Salt solution, intravenous fluids, antibiotics
- In unprepared communities, death rates can be as high as 50 percent



In the large intestine

1 Bacteria multiply rapidly

2 Toxin from bacteria penetrates cells of intestinal wall

3 Toxin prevents intestine from absorbing water from digested food; diarrhea, dehydration result
