



As per the child labour prohibition Act-2016, person below age of 14 is considered as child. Hence, labour performed by such person is considered as child labour.

Although participating in cultural works like music, cinema, sports with consent of child is not considered child labour.

In India, child labour is a deep-rooted issue. Major people working in Hotel and Hospitality industry of unorganised sector, mines, industries, cottage industries, shops, Dhabhas are minor.

In India the structure of economy and population pressure promotes child labour. India is a developing nation. There is lack of employment, low per capita income, poverty and inflation are its peaks, creates

pressure on families to introduce their children to work.

Along with it, lack of proper development of industries, major unorganised sector small cottage industries are there, in which child labour is found more.

Government of India make legal efforts and organise social awareness programmes to eradicate child labour.

The child labour prohibition Act, implies punishment of 2 years with penalty of 20K, and 3 years punishment with penalty of 50K and license of employer will be declared void.

But it is condition of dilemma, because strict prohibition of child labour also creates problem of livelihood for thousands of families, people of unorganised sectors.

According to Multi-dimensional poverty Index, more than 16 crore Indians are still below poverty level, in these families child labour is necessary for livelihood.
